We visit patients at the KCVA to brighten their day and remind them that their service is remembered and appreciated. We sponsor two American Legion Baseball Teams, we send Boys to Boys State, and our Auxiliary sends Girls to Girls State where they learn how to form a representative republic. We sponsor medals for military and academic excellence to JROTC Cadets in Independence Schools, and we provide emergency assistance to local veterans in need.

These are just a few of the things we do to make a difference and why we have been the one constant people have been able to count on for over 100 years. If you would like to learn more about what you can do help us make a difference, we would love to hear from you. For the "why should I pay my dues" crowd, it is because without your membership we would not be able to support the worthy causes outside of our post walls that deserve our time and effort.

If you have not yet paid your dues for the 2020 legion year, I hope you will join us in our renaissance so that we can continue to make a difference. Our membership honors every Post 21 member that came before us. It is there legacy we inherited and it up to us to write the next great chapter in our historic posts story. 
