The post has 806 members renewed as of December 26, 2022. If you know of a member who has not renewed their dues, PLEASE have them contact me to pay them.

If you have not paid your membership dues for Legion year 2023, by December 31, 2022 you will be considered delinquent and until your dues are paid you will be removed from the newsletter list and will not receive a newsletter from the Post. PLEASE renew your dues. Renewal notices have been mailed by National. When you receive your notice, PLEASE send it in. The goal for the Post this year is 1021 as determined by State. There are several ways to renew your dues, first is to pay online at https://www.legion.org/ second is to mail them to the post or visit the post and pay them in person. When you mail in your renewal it comes to the post not National.

National has implemented a new method for renewing your dues. First you need to create an account at mylegion.org. Once you have created an account look at the column Legion Membership summary. Look for view details, click on it then scroll down until you find the auto renew block. You will probably have to enter your credit card information to get auto renew set up. Once you have done that your dues will auto renew every year. If you need help in setting up an account, please contact me and I will help you get it set up.

With the new leadership in place for the next year, it is time to discuss your involvement in the Post. Over the last several years the Post leadership has essentially been the same people. For a Post with over 1000 members that breaks down to about 1 0r 2%. To ensure that YOUR Post will be here for many years to come, it is imperative that all members become involved with the Post. Camp Lejeune Information

Veterans and family members who used contaminated water at Camp Lejeune can finally file lawsuits to recover damages for toxic exposure - but now unscrupulous lawyers are lining up to get rich off of them.

Since passage of the Camp Lejeune Justice Act earlier this year, predatory law firms have blanketed the airwaves of television, radio, and social media with marketing campaigns targeting veterans through sponsored content. With no federal limits on contingencies, lawyers can charge fees upwards of 60% to sick veterans. We cannot allow this exploitation to persist.

The American Legion has urged congressional oversight to ensure veterans' protections against predatory law firms and demand Congress agree on legislation reasonably limiting attorney's fees in actions related to Camp Lejeune claims.

This begins with bringing attention to this issue across the Senate. The American Legion urges you to write your Senators and tell them to come to bipartisan agreement to protect veterans from legal scams as soon as possible!




