

Webmaster: In search of someone to maintain the

Post website. Responsibilities include updating the calendar as well as upload current newsletters and flyers. Updating the look of the website is also desired.



Time required: Average time spent on the website not counting design changes should only require 3-4 hours per month.

Qualifications: Computer skills are essential. Previous webpage design helpful but not requires. Basic training is provided.

Dance Committee: Needing multiple people or couples interested in helping host the Saturday Night Country Dance. Responsibilities include greeting guest, maintaining order and assisting in securing the building after the dance. Having 4 people/couples in this position would mean you would only host 1 dance per month.

Time required: Approximately 6 hours per dance.

Reporters: Looking for candidates interested in attending post functions, taking pictures and writing articles about the event. No special requirements for this position beyond basic computer/email



skills and a desire to help communicate what is going on at Post 21.

Time Required: Varies

Assistant Newsletter Editor: Needing someone to assist the Newsletter Editor in collecting and laying out information for the monthly newsletter.



Requirements: Computer Skills. Knowledge of Microsoft WORD and Microsoft PUBLISHER are required.

Time Required: 4-5 hours per month

Inventory Clerk: This position requires the candidate to maintain the inventory of food and associated utensils (i.e.: Cups, plates, napkins, etc). You will check the weekly menu and compile a list of food and other items needed. Will also need to make periodic trips to Restaurant Depot, Sams, etc to pick up items that can't be ordered. Stocking items are included. Inventory must be done on Monday AM.

Time Required: 3-5 hours per week.

Post Adjutant: The Adjutant shall have charge of and keep a full and correct record of all proceedings of all meetings, keep such records as the Department and National organizations may require, render reports of membership annually or when called upon at a meeting, and under the direction of the commander handle all correspondence of the post. He/She keeps the membership records, minutes of meetings, prepares a list of unfinished matters from the minutes of the previous meeting for inclusion in the commander's agenda.

Time Required: 10 hours per week (More or less during heavy or light membership periods)

Compensation: This position carries a \$200 per month stipend

Cashier/Food Order Takers/Runners:

Duties: Pleasant Greeting, Accurately taking of orders, Menus knowledge and basic math.

Time Required: Tuesday and or Friday 4:45pm-
